Professor Blegen presents an account of the results of the expedition undertaken by the American School of Classical Studies, describing the remains brought to light, the vestiges of the settlement itself, the deposits and burials of the Neolithic age, the Middle Helladic graves, and the late Helladic chamber tombs. The book concludes with general remarks on the chamber tombs, and detailed discussions of the jewellery, bronzes, terra-cottas, and pottery.
