The article should have been rightly cast as a dialogue with Professor Shuger's previous work on Caussin. A beginning note of indebtedness to her work was and is inadequate. Additionally the description of the frontispiece to Caussin's work on hieroglyphics (Campbell, 50) should be noted explicitly as a translation of Fumaroli's description contained in his L'age d'eloquence (1980).

The contribution of these scholars to the study of Renaissance thought is held in high esteem, in fact, with reverence and gratitude. They cannot be denied the dignity of their own work and expression.
