### **The Social Setting of the Ministry as Reflected in the Writings of Hermas, Clement and Ignatius**

*Harry O. Maier*

Focussing on three first- and early second-century documents (the Shepherd of Hermas, 1 Clement and the Ignatian epistles), this work contributes to a growing body of literature concerned with the social setting of early Christianity. Maier argues that the development of structures of leadership in the early Christian church is best accounted for by reference to the hospitality, patronage and leadership of wealthy hosts who invited local Christian groups to meet in their homes. Sociological models and types are employed to analyze the tensions which arose from excesses of patronage and leadership by the well-to-do.

In recognizing the socio-economic setting of these conflicts, a corrective is provided to those studies which would interpret early Christian conflict over the ministry in purely theological or doctrinal terms.
