SUBSCRIPTIONS

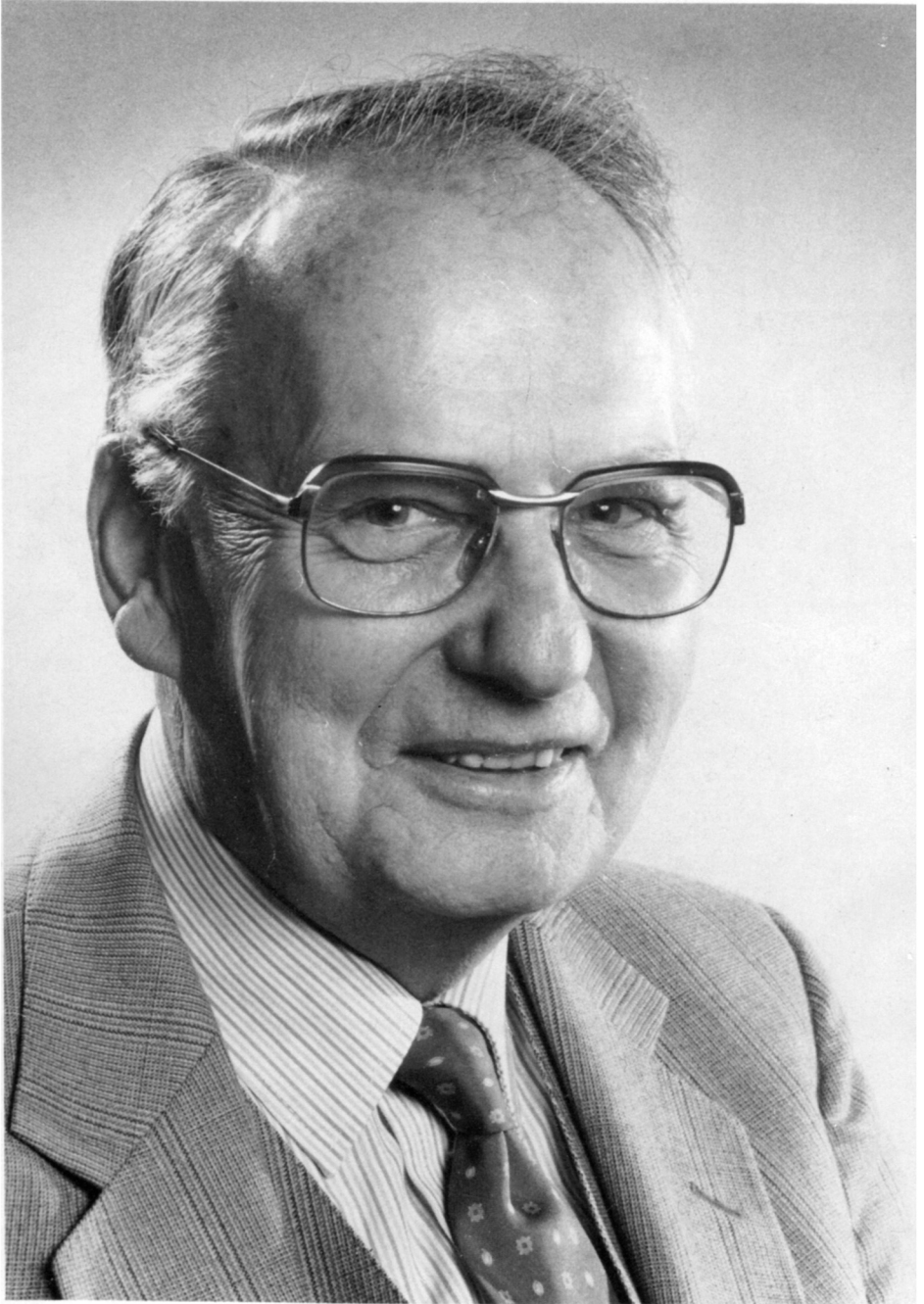
The Journal of African Law is published in two parts a year, spring and autumn, making one volume.
