## William Manson D.D.

Hodder & Stoughton beg to draw the attention of all readers of this Journal to the fact that just before his death The Rev. Professor William Manson of Edinburgh had completed and delivered what may prove to be his most personal and spiritually helpful book which will be published in September/October under the title **THE WAY OF THE CROSS**.

This work began life as a series of Passiontide addresses in St. Giles' Cathedral, Edinburgh: now prepared for permanent life it has become the most personal book this famous New Testament scholar has ever given us—it is both theological and devotional. Dr Manson makes a deep response to the saving work of Christ but it is formulated in theological terms. 'As come from God and yet as man among men on earth, He is for Christian faith at once the manifestation of God to sinful men and, in virtue of His complete identification of Himself with us, He is the supreme Response or answer-back of our souls to God.' This is the language of theology rather than devotion, yet this is essentially a Passiontide book. But then 'theology is one part of the gift which Jesus Christ has brought us. Indeed the New Testament says that eternal life consists in knowing the Father of Jesus Christ as true God.' Again and again the deep feeling of the author is disclosed through the theological account of his faith, and the reader becomes strongly aware of it. And the later studies, particularly *The Overcoming of Self* are more directly personal and moving. Although he writes as a theologian the author writes also as a penitent and believer. Personal conviction and experience are expressed in the terms of classical theology. A remarkable work in the same class as Moule's *The Sacrifice of Christ* and Dodd's *Apostolic Preaching*. It is hoped also to include a short tribute to Dr Manson.

The author believes that in the struggle with the Goliath of materialism and scepticism the recent tendency to rely entirely on history and on the authority of The Word, to the exclusion of all appeal to Moral Reason, is to load David with Saul's armour.

The first part of this book attempts to draw out with almost brutal frankness the implications of a denial of the Christian faith in the survival of human personality after death. He defends the Christian belief in the survival of the complete human individual, and criticises all attempts to compromise between this and a belief in complete extermination. In the second part he discusses certain problems of Christian origins, and insists that in the appeal to history we must distinguish between what is certain and what is merely tenable or arguable.
