13 Radiocarbon

A radiocarbon date should always be cited along with its reference number, in its standard conventional form, e.g. OxA-6745 or Q-223.

ANTIQUITY uses the following conventions:

Lower-case 'b.p.' for uncalibrated radiocarbon determinations, e.g. '4550±50 b.p.' Notice, this should be referred to in text as a determination, not a date,

because it is a measure indicating age, not a date in real years.

Upper-case for calibrated radiocarbon determinations, expressed in BP, AD or BC as you prefer, e.g. '1340±100 BP' or, for the same date in AD/BC, 'AD 610±100'.

All good radiocarbon practice avoids 'uncalibrated' b.c. dates, produced by subtracting 1950 from an uncalibrated b.p. determination, and we ask you not to use them. Nor do we use the common convention of cal BP/cal BC/cal AD. Please use either *Radiocarbon* 1993 or more recent radiocarbon calibration curves. Please state which calibration you are using.

TABLES of radiocarbon determinations are conveniently published as follows:

Please use carefully and differentiate near-synonyms 'determination', 'date', 'years old', 'years ago' and 'Before Present'.
