

## LIBRARIES AND ARCHIVES

*CLAH Activities in Progress*—According to the Conference on Latin American History *Newsletter* of October 1966, several CLAH publications projects are still in progress. The first CLAH publication, *Latin American History. Essays on its Study and Teaching, 1898–1965*, a two-volume anthology of writings edited by Howard Cline, is in press at the University of Texas Press with an expected publication date of early spring 1967.

The Union List of Latin American newspapers in major U.S. repositories is nearing completion, and a finished manuscript was expected before December 31, 1966.

The University of Texas reports progress in preparing for publication the 1579–1585 *Relaciones Geográficas* in their collections.

By September 15, 1966, nine of the 30 contributors to the *Guide to Historical Literature of Latin America*, under the editorship of Charles Griffin, had submitted the manuscripts of their sections. These consist of short introductory essays and select critical bibliographies of the topic, area, or period covered by the section. It is hoped that all the remaining contributions will be submitted before June 1967. It appears unlikely, however, that publication will occur before early 1969.

CLAH is cooperating with the Committees on Scholarly Resources of the Latin American Studies Association to develop a program to bring into print scholarly materials now out-of-print. CLAH members are asked to suggest titles. Preliminary inquiries among publishers indicate many older titles actually remain in small stocks, not listed in *Books in Print*. The Secretariat will be pleased to furnish information on these from Hispanic Foundation-LASA files.

*Creighton University Adds to Bolivian Collection*—For more than two years the University has been concentrating its book purchasing effort in the direction of the projected Creighton Center for Bolivian Studies. Eventually the University hopes to be able to offer historical scholars the largest selection of research materials relating to Bolivia in the Midwest.

*University of Houston Acquires Latin American Holdings*—In its effort to develop a strong Latin American Studies program, the University of Houston has recently acquired a sizable number of Brazilian books. It also has the Willis K. Jones collection, which places the library in a select group in the field of Latin American theater.

*University of London Notes Available Latin American Collections*—The library of the Institute of Latin American Studies, which began operation in 1966, is limited to bibliographies, guides, aids to research, newspapers, and reference works. Bernard Naylor, the Institute's bibliographer-librarian, is now compiling a union catalogue of all books and pamphlets relating to Latin America in London libraries.

Other London libraries with collections of value to Latin American scholars include the University Library, the library of University College, the Latin American History Library built up in collaboration with the Institute of Historical Research, the Political Economy Library, the American Geography Library, Donaldson Library, the British Library of Political and Economic Science at the London School of Economics, King's College Library, Queen Mary College Library, the Institute of Archaeology, Institute of Advanced Legal Studies, and the Institute of Education. An important collection on Amerindian Languages is at the School of Oriental and African Studies. The Hispanic and Luso-Brazilian Councils readily make their library of between 15,000 and 20,000 volumes at Canning House accessible to accredited students.

*PAU Compiles Book List for Latin American Universities*—A detailed plan for the compilation of a selection list of 75,000 books and periodical titles for Latin American university libraries was the product of a meeting of experts held recently in San José, Purua, Mexico. The Pan American Union, with a grant from the Council on Library Resources, sponsored the session. Although based on California's "new campuses lists" of books, the selection will give greater emphasis to books in Spanish and Portuguese and original works by Latin American authors. The Union of Latin American Universities has accepted responsibility for the project and for appointing a fulltime staff to carry it out over a three-year period. The selection of titles from preliminary subject lists will be made by experts in the hemisphere and the compilation of bibliographic information will be handled by automated means. A quarterly selection journal and five-year revisions will keep the list up-to-date. With the publication of the basic list of titles, Latin American university librarians will for the first time have authoritative assistance in the selection of materials appropriate for their institutions. The Pan American Union will give general sponsorship and guidance to the project with the University of Texas serving in an advisory capacity in selection and automated compilation.

*SALALM Resolution on Census and Statistical Publications*—The 11th Seminar on the Acquisition of Latin American Library Materials (New York City, July 7–9, 1966) passed a resolution requesting the Ad Hoc Committee on Official Publications to compile a first priority list of census and statistical

publications. The compilation would aid Microcard Editions, Inc., in initiating a copying program to complete existing collections and build new ones.

*University of Texas Sponsors Guide to Manuscript Sources*—The Institute of Latin American Studies at the University of Texas is responsible for a project to compile a guide to manuscript sources on Latin America in the United States. Gunnar Mendoza, the archivist of Bolivia, is program director. For a full description of the undertaking, see the Research Inventory, p. 146, (627).

### NAS-NRC Fellowship Pamphlets
