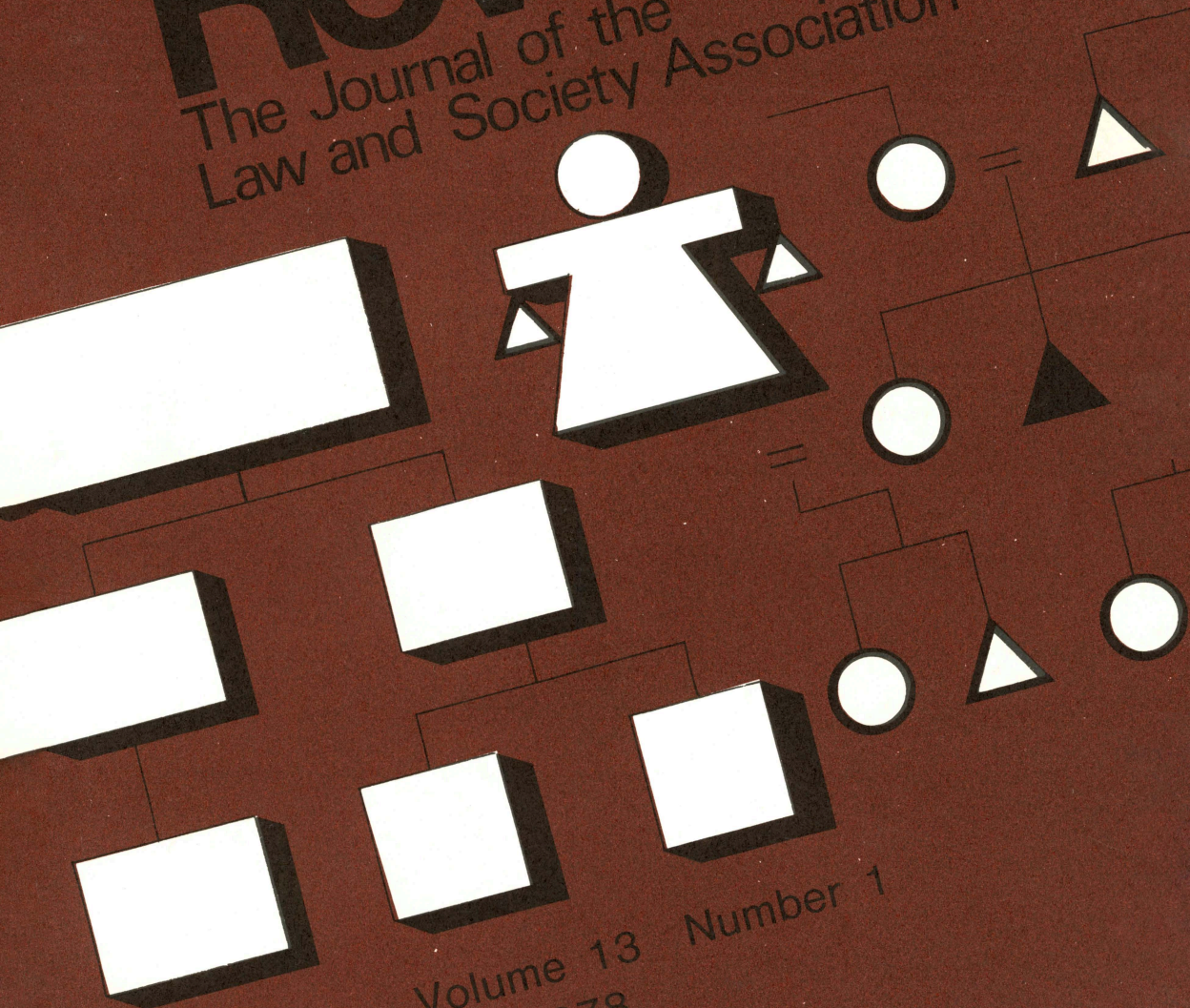

FREQUENCY AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

The *Law & Society Review* is published quarterly each year: Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer. Second class postage is paid at Denver, Colorado, and additional mailing offices.

Subscriptions may be entered on either a calendar year or a volume basis. Each volume consists of approximately 640 pages (plus index). Nonmember and institutional rates for a one-year (quarterly publication) subscription are \$25.00 (\$27.00 outside the U.S.). Special two- and three-year rates are available on request. *Single copies* of the current issue may be obtained from the Association at \$6.50 each. *Single copies* of back issues are available at \$7.50 each, except for Volume 3, Nos. 2 and 3 (combined issue), and Volume 7, No. 4, which are \$10.00 each, and Volume 11, No. 2 (Special Issue), which is \$2.00.
