

trative abilities of a great national leader in a time of grave economic crisis. Hoover, Warren writes, was a President who "could not command" and "could not summon the mass of the people to his support." Moreover, Hoover was unwilling "to face the economic facts of international life," and he and the Republican party "ignored the indictment of outraged citizens, ignored the millions of farmers, denied labor's reasonable demands for justice." Finally, Hoover put too much faith in a business system controlled by "irresponsible industrial imperialists," "cynical financiers," and "corporation officials whose ethics would have exiled them from any jungle."
