It is unfortunate that the price of the volume at the present rate of exchange is about £12, so that it is only accessible to reviewers and the very rich, but to deplore this figure (the whole handbook costs £37) is the only adverse criticism we have to offer.

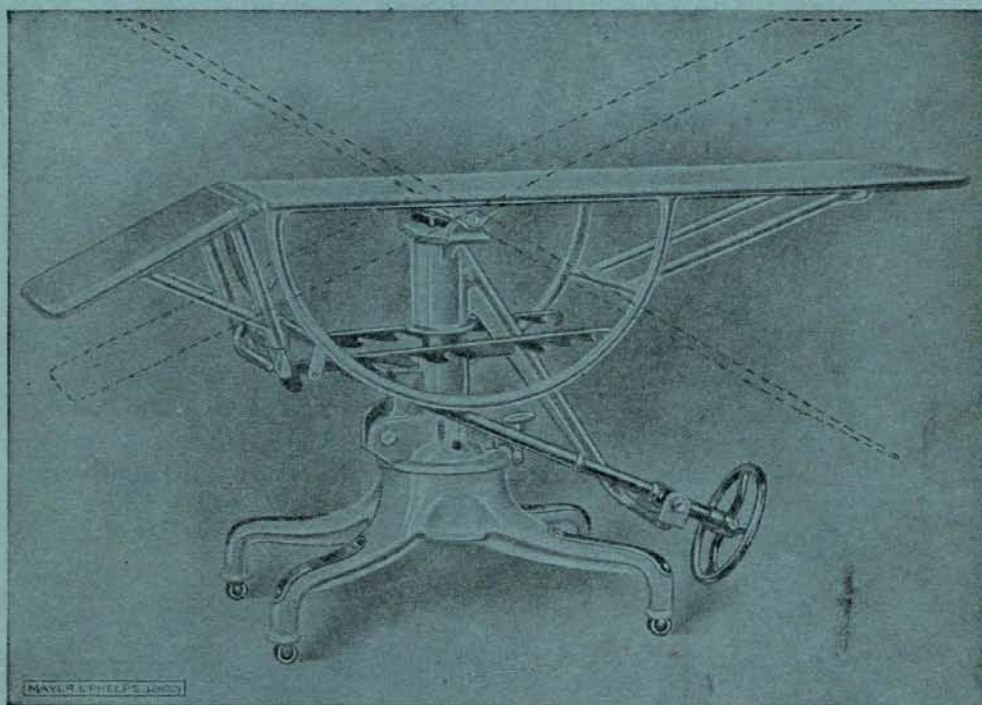
