

P-1487 - THE FEASIBILITY OF IDENTIFYING, TREATING AND IMPROVING OUTCOMES IN 'HARD-TO-REACH' YOUNG PEOPLE WITH MULTIPLE COMPLEX MENTAL DISORDERS

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Introduction: 'Hard To Reach' Young People (HTRYP) (5-10% of all YP) refers to marginalised, disadvantaged individuals who slip through the healthcare system and/or are unwilling to engage with health services.

Aims/Objectives: To:

- identify a cohort of HTRYP
- provide a new specialist community-based mental health service
- evaluate outcomes

Methods: A multidisciplinary team (established January-December 2011), was based within an inner-city healthcare centre, North-East England.

Results: Forty referrals received [aged 15-25 (mean: 18.3, M:F=15:21)].
