## LIBRARIES AND ARCHIVES

### **Center for Studies on Mexican History Houses Documents**

In order to facilitate the research of scholars in Mexican history, the Centro de Estudios de Historia de México, with financial aid from a commercial firm, Condumex, S. A., has developed an extensive and important collection of manuscripts, documents, photographs, and reference works which date from the sixteenth century to the present time. More than 35,000 volumes, 200,000 documents, and 5000 photographs are housed in the Centro library which makes them available to all interested historians. ### **University of Florida Project of Serial Documentation Nears Completion**

Begun in January 1965, the University of Florida-based project of listing of holdings in the United States and Canada for as many serial documents as could be identified for individual Latin American countries, from the time of each country's formation (or date of independence) through 1966, is nearing completion. Publication of the nineteen-volume set on Latin American Serial Documents will be by country: Volumes I and II, on Colombia and Brazil respectively, published in the fall 1968, are to be followed by volumes on Cuba and Mexico in mid-1969 and other countries, in alphabetical order, by 1970.

In the bibliographies, a broad interpretation for documents was used;

listings include publications of governmental agencies, national museums, libraries, universities, and autonomous entities. Arrangement of the listings is by authors or titles, with information included on beginning date of the serial, place of publication, frequency, notes on content and administrative setup, and U. S. institutions with major holdings of the particular serial. In order to compile such information, a cooperative effort resulted between the University of Florida, the Farmington Plan Library, the New York Public Library, the Library of Congress, and seventeen institutional and university libraries with the strongest Latin American holdings in the United States.

Beyond the purpose of identifying what publications are available in the United States and Canada is the goal to fill in holdings wherever possible, giving more complete access to titles in Latin American documentation. #### **University of Florida Plans Publication of Urban Annual**

The Center for Latin American Studies of the University of Florida, in cooperation with Sage Publications, will begin publication in late 1969 of the *Latin American Urban Annual*. Edited by Francine F. Rabinovitz and Felicity Trueblood, the annual will have as its purpose the outlining of projects of original research on Latin American urbanization and urban policy problems, along with related bibliographic surveys and outstanding articles which have received only limited circulation. U. S. members of the International Advisory Board of the annual are Marvin Alisky, Arizona State University, John Friedmann, Ford Foundation (Chile), William Mangin, Syracuse University, Richard Morse, Yale University, T. Lynn Smth, University of Florida, and Francis Violich, University of California. Contributions, in French, Spanish, Portuguese, or English, are being solicited for the issues. #### **Ford Foundation Grant Aids Collection at University of Miami**

A \$100,000 grant from the Ford Foundation will support the expansion of holdings of primary research materials on contemporary Cuba at the University of Miami. A recent listing of reference works in the field of Latin American studies available for purchase by libraries and interested organizations includes the *Subject Catalog of the Special Panama Collection of the Canal Zone Library-Museum* and the *Research Catalogue of the American Geographical Society*. The first catalog includes card listings of items relating to the planning and construction of the existing Panama Canal and works on pioneer exploration and voyages in the region, early surveys for a canal and railroad, and post-1914 projects of improvement. The catalog of the American Geographical Society, published in 1962, is classed in two parts, General and Regional. The individual Regional section on Latin America is available separately. ### University of Pittsburgh Library Acquires Cuban Materials

The University of Pittsburgh is expanding and completing its library collection of Cuban periodicals by subscribing to almost all of the important journals and purchasing old issues. Collections of newspapers such as *Revolución*, *Granma*, and *Hoy* have also been acquired, in addition to a complete collection of Cuban radio reports which includes all speeches of Fidel Castro and Che Guevara since December 1961. Permission to import books from Cuba has been obtained, and at present, the Latin American bibliographer and a graduate assistant are compiling lists of Cuban books to be purchased by the library. ### Fulbright-Hays Awards Available for Advanced Research, University Lecturing

The Committee on International Exchange of Persons of the Conference Board of Associated Research Councils conducts the programs of grants for Advanced Research and University Lecturing abroad by U. S. scholars. Eligibility requirements for Advanced Research grants include U. S. citizenship at the time of application, proficiency in a foreign language in some cases, and a doctoral degree or faculty standing equivalent. Candidates for the University Lecturing grants need not possess a doctoral degree, but must have college or university teaching experience at the level for which application is made. Awards are for the duration of the academic year, in most cases, of the host institution—in Latin America, usually from March or April to the following December or January. Terms of the awards for both types of grants include
