The Program will include course work at the graduate level, lectures, informal seminars, and research. Participants are encouraged to tailor their work to individual interests and requirements.

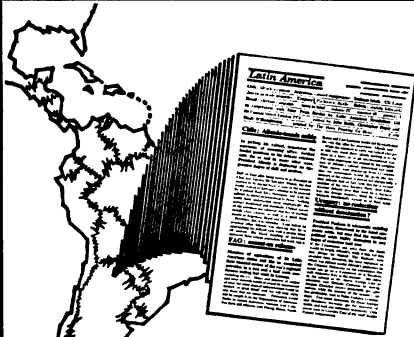

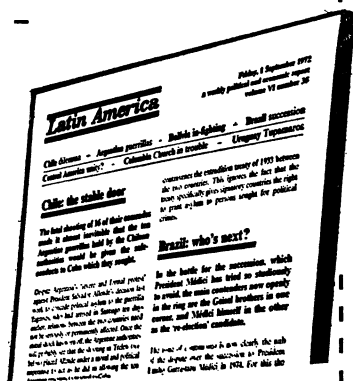

In this impressive book, Mr. Conrad analyzes the economic basis of slavery and the internal trade in slaves and rejects the theory that, as a group, the wealthy coffee planters of São Paulo were in the vanguard of abolitionism. Considerable attention is devoted to the attitudes and political motivation of both slave-holders and abolitionists.

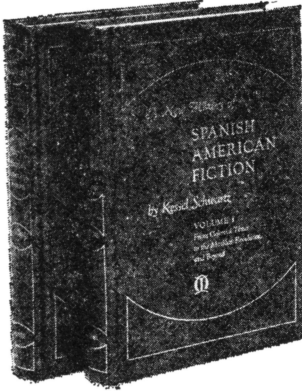
