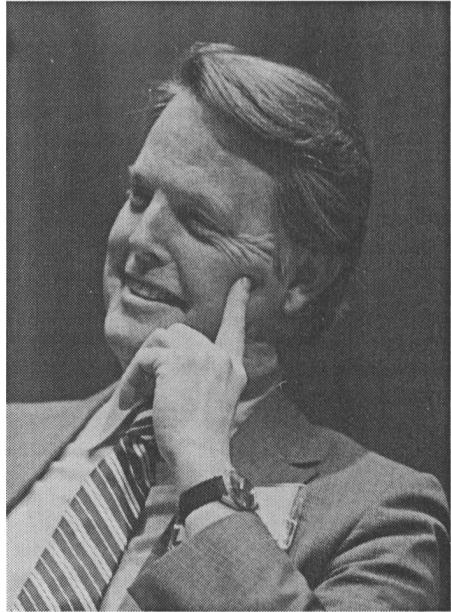


tions. Other participants on this Saturday evening plenary session will include Nelson W. Polsby of the University of California at Berkeley and a representative of the Washington press corps.

The first annual Lasswell symposium will address issues relating to the application of the social sciences in government, public policy and the society more generally. Seymour Martin Lipset, President of APSA, will chair this Friday evening session on "The Uses of Social Science."

Lipset will deliver his presidential address at the first plenary session on Thursday evening following the presentation of awards for scholarly achievements in political science. □

Nobel Prize winner Herbert A. Simon of Carnegie-Mellon University will be a panelist on the first annual Lasswell Symposium at the 1982 APSA Annual Meeting on September 3 in Denver.

Short Courses Offered

APSA will offer two concurrent special courses for Annual Meeting attendees on Wednesday, September 1, the day before the official opening of the Annual Meeting. W. A. E. Skurnik of the University of Colorado at Boulder will conduct an all-day seminar on coverage of foreign news in the American press.

After a morning session which will include an analysis of available empirical data on the determinants of foreign news coverage, an afternoon panel will be convened. A representative of the wire services as well as a newspaper editor will give a brief presentation which will be followed by audience participation.

In the other short course Diane Fowlkes of Georgia State University and Susette Talarico of the University of Georgia will conduct an afternoon workshop on new teaching materials on women in American politics, which can be incorporated into existing American government courses.



Donna E. Shalala, president of Hunter College, will address issues relating to the application of social sciences in government, public policy, and the society—the theme of the Lasswell Symposium—at the Annual meeting. Shalala is former assistant secretary for Policy Development and Research at the Department of Housing and Urban Development in the Carter administration.

Placement Service Set For Annual Meeting

Eighty-one percent of new Ph.D.s found jobs last year, many with the help of the Annual Meeting Placement Service.

This service allows employers to review the vitae of job applicants and to interview them at the Annual Meeting. Also, applicants can review the list of positions which are open in their respective fields and can apply for positions in which they are interested.

The Placement Service will be open from

September 2-5 and will be held in the Vail and Breckenridge Suites of the Denver Hilton.

Air Fares Reduced For Denver Convention

APSA has arranged with United Airlines a 30 percent discount off regular roundtrip coach fares to the Association's Annual Meeting in Denver. This substantially reduced rate is available only by calling a special unlisted toll-free number of United's Convention Desk ((800) 521-0810; Michigan residents: (800) 481-0243).

The special convention air fare is available under the following conditions:

- This fare is 30 percent lower than the normal roundtrip coach fare in effect at the time the ticket is purchased.
- Travel must be roundtrip on United only. No minimum stay is required. No en route stopovers are allowed.
- Travel may commence no earlier than August 28 and must be completed on or before September 11, 1982. Reservations for this discounted coach fare must be made and tickets purchased by you or your travel agent at least 30 days in advance of the originating flight.
