### BRITISH BULLETIN PUBLICATIONS

*The British Bulletin of Publications on Latin America, the West Indies, Portugal and Spain* reviews the latest books published in this field and is issued twice a year by the Library of Canning House, the Hispanic Council and the Luso Brazilian Council, London, England. ### CAMBRIDGE CENTRE

The Cambridge Center in collaboration with the Oxford Centre is launching a new series under the general title *Oxford and Cambridge Latin American Papers*, to be published by David & Charles. The series is designed to give an outlet to substantial research papers, at a post-doctoral level, which fall between the lengths suited for publication in journals or as independent monographs. Three or four papers will be published in each volume, and volumes on Argentina, Colombia and on Communications in Latin America, are now in preparation.

### THE HISPANIC-LUSO REPORTS 1906-1941

This set of British Foreign Office Annual Reports was to be published in 1972 by the TIFC Inter-American Corporation, P.O. Box 13361, Houston, Texas 77019. The reports emphasize political, economic and military activity for Spain, Portugal and 13 Latin American nations. The cost of this 18 volume set is estimated at \$750.00.

### EL IMPARCIAL

The Library of Congress has recently acquired 219 reels of positive microfilms of the newspaper, *El Imparcial*, published in Madrid from March 16, 1867 to May 30, 1933. The microfilm which is available to Library of Congress readers is for the

periods January 1870 to May 22, 1874, January 1875 to June 1932, and October 25, 1932 to May 30, 1933.

The microfilming of *El Imparcial* was recommended by a group of U.S. historians specializing in modern Spanish history who met to discuss holdings of Spanish newspapers in U.S. libraries during the annual meeting of the American Historical Association in 1966. Positive microfilms of *El Imparcial* for the 1870–1833 period may be purchased from the Photographic Service, British Museum, London, WC1. The cost is £3 5s per roll of microfilm.

### MICROFORM SCHOLARS' ORIGINALS

Microform Publishers International announces a new publication program which will enable timely publication of a scholar's monograph immediately upon completion of his manuscript. The MSO Program will utilize the standard microfiche as the medium of publication. Each microfiche will hold up to 98 letter-size pages of information which has been photographically reduced to 1/24th the original size. These microfiche can be viewed on any standard microfiche reader.

The criteria for acceptance of a manuscript for publication in the MSO Program is that the work be useful information of value to other scholars, scientists and researchers in the author's field. The emphasis is on information content—the dissemination of ideas and knowledge—rather than style or form.

Microfilm Publishers International will edit each accepted manuscript for consistency and return it to the author with standard form for final typing of the edited manuscript. Upon return of the manuscript, MPI will catalog and film it for publication. The MSO monographs will be marketed by catalog mailings, specialized direct mail to individuals and by direct sale to libraries of all types. ### PRESENT PROBLEMS OF FOREIGN PRIVATE INVESTMENT IN LATIN AMERICA

The proceedings of this colloquium held in Hamburg, West Germany, October

13–14, 1971 have now been published. The meeting was organized by the Ibero-American Association and the Institute of Latin American Studies, both of Hamburg, and the German Foundation for Developing Countries, Berlin. The participants were representatives of Inter-American institutions and Latin American countries, with a limited number of European Latin American experts. #### NEW AND SUSPENDED PERIODICALS

The *Cuba Resource Center Newsletter* is one of several projects initiated by the Cuba Resource Center in 1971, its first year of existence. The Cuba Resource Center is funded by protestant and Roman Catholic church groups. The *Newsletter* is published six times a year and examines Cuba's drive for development and the struggle to create a new man and woman. Each issue focuses on a major theme. Issues have been centered around Chilean-Cuban relations, education and culture in Cuba, women in the revolution, and health care. Regular features include information on religion in Cuba, resumé of U.S. press coverage of Cuban issues, excerpts from the English-language weekly *Granma*, book reviews, documents and coming events. Subscriptions are \$5.00 a year for individuals; \$10.00 for institutions.

*Dualismo*, Revista del Centro de Estudios Económicos y Sociales de la Facultad de Economía de la Universidad Veracruzana (Mexico) first appeared in the summer of 1972. The purpose of this new journal is to publish the results carried out in this Center. Issues will be published twice a year and made up of articles and reports. The editorial board is composed of Maria de la Luz Aguilera Mejía, Antonio Pulido Chintú, Luis Miguel Ramos Boyoli and Francisco Salmerón Tinajero. Annual subscription costs \$3.00 US. *Education* is a new quarterly journal published by the Cuban Ministry of Education. It is dedicated to the world educational movement and offers articles about Cuban educational policy, essays, translations, commentaries, and resumes of books and pedagogical publications. Two important regular features will be added in the future: "Current Education" and "Reference Section." A subscription costs \$2.00 US an issue or \$6.00 US for a full year, postage included. Payment may be made by money order or bank draft from banks whose main branches are not in the United States or dependent countries. Payment cannot be accepted in US dollars but will be accepted in Canadian dollars, English pounds, French francs, or Swiss francs. *Iberian Studies* is an independent journal published by the University of Keele, England. It contains articles, bibliographies, reviews, research directories, notes,

queries and correspondence. Some of the articles will be papers read at conferences of the Iberian Social Studies Association, but other authoritative studies of Spain and Portugal and their overseas territories will be included. Latin America is not included in the journal's sphere, except when there is an obvious connection. Articles are published in English, Spanish and Portuguese. The Editorial Board consists of Managing Editor, John Naylor, Department of Geography; Literary Editor, Neil F. Bruce, Department of Politics; and Business Editor, Roy P. Bradshaw, Department of Geography. The journal is published twice a year, in spring and autumn, and began publication in 1972. The price is £2.00 per year for the United Kingdom and Europe, and \$5.50 for the United States, which includes postage and packing. Direct subscriptions and inquiries to: R. P. The Department of Information and Public Affairs of the Organization of American States is unable to continue subsequent editions of the *Inter-American Briefs*. A shortage of personnel and a freeze on hiring which has affected the entire Organization of American States has caused this journal to suspend publication. It is hoped that the newsletter can be resumed on a continuing basis at some time in the future.

*Pesquisa e Planejamento* is the new semestral journal of the Instituto de Planejamento Económico e Social. The editor-in-chief of this periodical is Hamilton Carvalho Tolosa. *Regional and Urban Economics: Operational Methods* is a new journal made up of papers devoted to operational solutions of problems in urban and regional economics, essentially model-oriented. The fields encompassed by the journal have been multiregional models, recent extensions of input-output techniques, multiregional programming of activities, urban models, and computation of optimal policies for urban regions or intra-urban sectors. Recent fields, like optimal control models for the environment, will be covered and one or more special issues will be devoted to them. Book reviews and occasional controversies animate the journal. The journal began publication in May 1971 and is edited by: J. H. P. Paelinck, Netherlands Economic Institute, A. Fleisher, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and N. N. Nékrasov, Council for Studying Productive Forces of the U.S.S.R. *Regional and Urban Economics* is published in volumes of approximately 400 pages, each consisting of four quarterly issues of 100 pages.
