

The first part of this book deals with the constitutional issues of the Succession and such related matters as Fratricide and the 'Kafes', Abdications, and Depositions. The main theme is a lack of any fixed law of succession for Sultans, in a system where the source of power is fundamentally democratic. The later chapters are concerned with the organization of the Harem and the various types of marriage-alliances entered into by the sultans and their families. The book includes a very full set of genealogical tables.

This book is the study of the second part of the career of Muhammad from the standpoint of a modern historian. Like its predecessor, *Muhammad at Mecca* (21s. net), it is based on a fresh examination of the sources, and includes sociological investigations of a pioneering character. The main emphasis is on the political and social aspects of the events.

In the second part Greek pins are set against a European and Asiatic background, another attempt by the author to break down the traditional barriers between classical and prehistoric archaeology.
