THIS new edition of Ogg and Ray's distinguished textbook, **ESSENTIALS OF AMERICAN GOVERNMENT**, is the most completely rewritten of any of the revisions of Ogg and Ray's famous series of American government textbooks. *The Fifth Edition* represents a painstaking reconsideration of the entire text in the light of what has happened since the publication of the previous edition. A considerable amount of new material has been added; some change has been made in the organization; and many of the chapters have been completely done over.
