The *Journal of Asian Studies*, known until September 1956 as the *Far Eastern Quarterly*, is published by the Association for Asian Studies (formerly The Far Eastern Association) in November, February, May and August. The annual institutional subscription rate for the *Journal* (including the *Bibliography of Asian Studies*) is \$40, postage included. Single issues of the *Journal* are available to institutions for \$10; single issues of the *Bibliography*, for \$20. Single issues of the *Journal* and *Bibliography* are available to non-members for \$10 each. Orders should be addressed to the Association for Asian Studies Secretariat. Issues published prior to February 1966 may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York 10003.

Membership in the Association for Asian Studies, a scholarly, non-political and non-profit organization, is open to all persons interested in Asia and the scholarly study of Asia. Annual membership dues are \$25 for Regular members, \$12.50 for Retired members and \$12.50 for Student members. Student membership is restricted to full-time students for a maximum of five years. Regular, Retired and Student members receive the *Journal of Asian Studies* and the *Asian Studies Newsletter*.

Members may order individual and back issues of the *Journal* at a cost of \$8 for Regular members and \$5 for Retired and Student members. Individual issues of the *Bibliography* cost \$8 for members. All correspondence regarding membership, subscriptions, advertising, reprints, or business should be addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer or Administrative Officer, Association for Asian Studies, Inc., Room 1, Lane Hall, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48109.

Manuscripts for publication and correspondence articles should be submitted to Professor Robert A. Kapp, Editor *Journal of Asian Studies*, DR-05, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington 98195. Manuscripts should be typed on 8 1/2 × 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the *A Manual of Style*, 12th ed. (Chicago, Univ. of Chicago Press, 1969), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.

Books for review and correspondence concerning reviews should be sent to the appropriate editor. Books on *Asia General*, *China*, and *Central Asia* should be sent to the office of the editor; books on *Japan* should be sent to Professor Byron K.
