Manuscripts for publication and correspondence articles should be submitted to Professor Robert A. Kapp, Editor Journal of Asian Studies, DR-05, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington 98195. Manuscripts should be typed on 8 1/2 × 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the A Manual of Style, 12th ed. (Chicago, Univ. of Chicago Press, 1969), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
